Born into a dairy farming family in Mohrsville, PA, the farm was an integral part of my upbringing. Growing up, living, and working on the farm with my parents, my older brother (by 14 months) and my paternal grandmother taught me many life lessons which are with me still today. The family farm remains in operation with my dad, mom and brother now growing grains as the primary product of the farm.

In this program, I had the benefit of serving with a dedicated pastoral staff in a mentoring and educational environment.
