Director's Note: An Update From Pam


Dear Library Patrons,

A hearty thank you to all our wonderful patrons from the staff of WPL! The Library re-opening has been very successful due to your support. Everyone has been exceptionally understanding of the new rules. We tried to be ready for anything and are relieved to say the process has been a smooth one. We are pleased with the results of our extensive planning and preparation, and we are <u>so</u> happy to see everyone again.

The Freedom Xpress van has returned the cases of books that were locked in the warehouses during shut down. The items are checked in and back on the shelves. If all goes as planned, interlibrary loans and reciprocal borrowing will resume mid-July. Be assured that Wiscasset Public Library plans to opt in to these amenities as soon as possible. Our goal is to restore patron services as quickly as safety allows.

We will be resuming our normal opening time of 10:00am, Tuesday through Saturday, starting July 1. Our safety precautions remain the same (see below); they have been effective and allowed us to thrive in this unusual environment. None of our plans would have worked without your cooperation. We are truly grateful for your contributions to our success.

COVID-19 Safety Precautions

- 10 patrons allowed in building at a time
- Face covering is required to be worn in the building (bring your own)
- Curbside delivery is available for those who can't wear a facial covering
- Use hand sanitizer immediately upon entering the building, even if you are wearing gloves
- Patrons must be symptom free of any illness for the last two weeks.
- 30-minute time limit

- Place items that you touched and aren't checking out on one of the tables, so they can be added to the quarantine cart. Do not return items to shelves.
- No public bathrooms
- No meetings
- The Used Book Room is closed until further notice
- Patrons who are non-compliant will be asked to leave the building

The Library is committed to keeping everyone safe and to maintaining a safe environment that will allow us to stay open. We can do this together!

Staff Picks: New Books at WPL








Series for Teens and Tweens
