# **COVID-19 Safety Precautions**

We are continually monitoring the COVID-19 news. Our top priority at this time is to provide library services to the public in the safest manner. Our current policies are:

- 10 patrons allowed in building at a time
- A face mask is required to be worn in the building (bring your own). A
  face shield is not an approved mask alternative at this time.
- Curbside delivery is available for those who can't wear a face mask
- Use hand sanitizer immediately upon entering the building, even if you are wearing gloves
- Patrons must be symptom free of any illness for the last two weeks
- 30-minute time limit
- Place items that you touched and aren't checking out on one of the tables, so they can be added to the quarantine cart. Do not return items to shelves.
- No public bathrooms
- No meetings
- Used Book Room sales are discontinued until further notice
- · Patrons who are non-compliant will be asked to leave the building

The Library is committed to keeping everyone healthy and to maintaining a safe environment that will allow us to stay open. We can do this together!

## **Book Review: Winterdance**

Winterdance: The Fine Madness of Running the Iditarod by Gary Paulsen

Gary Paulsen has won the Newbery Medal, Regina Medal, Dorothy Canfield Fischer Children's Book Award and many other awards for his coming of age stories that take place in the barren wilderness. He has written over 200 books, including books for adults, as well as articles, plays and short stories. His




nonfiction *Winterdance* leads the reader though Paulsen's quest to enter and run the Iditarod. Starting with his initial purchase of a racing team and the trials of training both the dogs and himself, this story finally brings you into one of the most dangerous races in the world. Travel this journey through snowstorms, frostbite, blinding winds and moose attacks. You will be amused and then enthralled by the challenges nature can throw at man and dog.
