From the Director -

Temperatures cool, leaves begin to change and daylight fades. September is like a precursor to fall, a time when many people begin to return to indoor interests. What a great time for interlibrary loans (ILLs) to return. You can begin placing holds on September 3.

The sudden shutdown of the system came as a great shock to many and emphasized the importance of this type of access. With little more than the click of a mouse we had millions of titles available. Thankfully, the new courier service has the routes and process set and we can go back to enjoying all of those materials once more.

With the restart of this service with a new van delivery vendor, we would like everyone to be measured in their number of requests because otherwise we run the risk of overwhelming the service with extremely high volume within the first few weeks. If an individual patron has more than 3 requests to submit the week of 9/3, I would ask that you space those requests out in the system over 2 or 3 weeks. This will also help library staff to gradually resume ILL processing over the first few weeks of the service. Please be mindful to help not crash the system.






Friends Cookbook Club

The Friends of Wiscasset Public Library's Cookbook Club met with scenic river views for our third dinner, where we sampled seasonal pestos and herbs picked from gardens around Wiscasset. The hors d'oeuvres began with bright and refreshing berry mojitos featuring homegrown mint and blueberries and included a light and savory pesto cheesecake, a delightful sun-dried tomato pesto served with torn mozzarella and crostini, a rich basil and cilantro pecan pesto served with warm garlic bread, and a fresh basil and garlic herb butter. The main course featured a succulent chicken and prosciutto with beet greens pesto, a gorgeous spaghetti squash with basil pecan pesto, a lush greek tortellini salad with a pesto vinaigrette, and a vibrant summer harvest penne pasta with fennel and

chive herbed butter. For dessert, we shared generous servings of warm peach and Maine berry cobbler, complete with melting scoops of vanilla ice cream. The potluck meal came together as a lovely celebration of late summer, and we all left our host's beautiful home quite full, and quite happy.
