

Treasure Island

by Robert Louis Stevenson

WPL is partnering with Maine State Music Theater and other local libraries to share *Treasure Island* by Robert Louis Stevenson. Wiscasset will host the following programs:

May 1-31 – Children guess how many chocolate doubloons are in the children's jar. Adults guess the number of Nuggets in the adult jar. In each group, the closest guess without going over wins the jar.

May 1-31 – The Children's Room will feature a Pirate Art Project. Children color their own design or use the provided coloring pages. Suggested project size is 8.5" x 11". Children who bring their project into the Library can submit their name for a chance to win a raffle prize. Each entrant receives a bag of Pirate Booty Snack. Raffle drawing will be held May 31. Pictures must be dropped off by Friday, May 31 before 5:00pm and will be on display at the Library from May until June.

May 3, 10:30am — Children are invited to enjoy a rollicking Story Time of pirates, parrots and mateys.

May 4 – While supplies last, pick up a Take and Make Craft Kit to fold and color your own treasure chest. Kit includes chest and embellishments.

May 8, 3:00-4:00pm – Treasure hunt: Children will search for hidden gold on the Library lawn and create a chest to hold their booty! Please call to let us know if you plan to attend. This program is limited to 12 children.

May 22, 5:00-6:30pm — Treasure Island adult book discussion: Patrons who attend the book discussion can enter their name into a raffle for a prize. Drawing will be held at the discussion.

Borrow an electricity monitor

Efficiency Maine is an independent administrator for programs to improve the efficiency of energy use and reduce greenhouse gases in Maine. As part of a statewide community outreach effort by Efficiency Maine, you can borrow an electricity monitor at WPL. The monitor will help you detect power use by your appliances and electronics. If a device is plugged in, it is using power – but do you

know how much? Simply plug the monitor into an electric outlet and plug an appliance into the monitor to get a readout of electricity use. Included instructions will help you calculate how much the appliance is

costing. The loaned monitor comes with a free "tool kit" brochure containing home energy saving tips.

Have you ever read a graphic novel? Graphic novels are complete stories (versus comic book periodicals) presented in cartoon-drawing format. These novels have existed since the 1820s but they gained popularity in the United States after the commercial success of Will Eisner's *A Contract With God*, published in 1978. There are many reasons to read graphic novels. They are fast-paced and fun to read. They can make daunting subject matter easier to understand. The artwork is often amazing and provides a different stimulus to exercise your brain.
