



Mac Smith, former news reporter for the Bar Harbor Times, will discuss his book Mainers on the Titanic. Mac tells the stories of passengers on that fateful ship who had ties to Maine. Meticulously researched, this book reveals the agonizing wait for news of what happened to their loved ones aboard and tells the stories of passengers from their boarding to the sinking, rescue, and arrival back in the country, and, for those who did not survive, their final coming ashore in Nova Scotia. It's a unique and fascinating addition to the Titanic story and to Maine history.

A lot of work goes on behind the scenes to make Wiscasset Public Library a great community resource. We like to introduce community members who contribute to our success. This month, meet Friend and volunteer **Kathi Lincoln**:

I was born in New Haven, CT, where I met my husband, J., while he was attending college in that city. We married right after he graduated in 1972 and moved to his home town of Wiscasset. We have been in Wiscasset since that time, except for 14 years when we lived 4 miles away in South Newcastle. Wiscasset was the ideal community to raise our son, Nathan, who now lives in Savan-

nah. I was fortunate to be able to volunteer in the classroom and during most field trips throughout his school years.

While working full time as a Human Resources Director at an agency in Brunswick (which is now Sweetser), I finished my B.S. degree at the University of Southern Maine. Having always had a deep interest and passion for issues concerning discrimination, I was happy to have been offered a job in Maine State Government as an EEO (Equal Employment Opportunity) Officer. I spent 27 years investigating illegal discrimination charges and providing training and management consultation in these matters. Although my office was in Augusta, I spent the majority of my time working in state institutions, prisons and offices throughout Maine.

Now, in addition to participating in the staffing of the Used Book Room and other "Friends" activities, I enjoy playing tennis several times a week year-round, volunteering at the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens and spending time on the water. My husband and I have always had a water craft of one sort or another and have been members of the Wiscasset Yacht Club since the mid 80's. I served 5 years on the Board, including 3 years as Membership Chair.

Having worked in and traveled many years in some very intense Maine winter weather, we are now spending winter months in warmer climates. Although this seems a bit unnatural for us, we are adjusting. Regardless, Maine is and always will be considered home.
