Autumn by Emily Dickinson

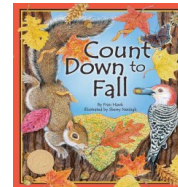
The morns are meeker than they were,

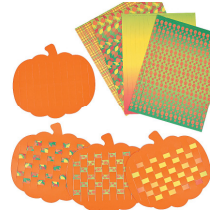
