
New Adult Fiction

New Non-Fiction

In his latest book, *Mindreader: The New Science of Deciphering What People Really Think, What They Really Want, and Who They Really Are*, leading lie-detection expert and noted psychotherapist David Lieberman, PhD, takes "people reading" to a whole new level. Drawing on the latest research in psycholinguistics—cues embedded in spoken and written speech—he shows you how to apply his cutting-edge methods to countless everyday situations. Understand the messaging behind passive language,



personal or impersonal descriptions, and level of detail. Determine whether someone's account of any incident is truthful. Learn whether a potential hire, dating app match, or new babysitter is trustworthy. Lieberman provides a practical approach to gaining greater insight into human nature.



Wisconsin, 2014: The nation is shocked by the arrest of two twelve-year-old girls who attempted to stab their classmate to death. The severity of their actions meant the girls would be tried as adults. Author Kathleen Hale spent seven years researching the case. 


