He earned a Ph.D. in English at the University of Connecticut and taught at universities in Iran, Turkey, Mali, and the US. In 2017 and 2018 he served as Poet Laureate for Belfast, Maine. 
#### Friends Cookbook Club

June's meeting of the Friends of Wiscasset Public Library's Cookbook Club saw its members enjoying sunset views of the Sheepscot while sampling delicious dishes from Erin Gleeson's The Forest Feast Mediterranean. The seven sections of recipes in this book lent itself perfectly to each of our seven attendees choosing one section, and bringing a dish or two from it. Our menu included, but was not limited to burst tomatoes and torn mozzarella, strawberry tinto de verano, a chickpea and torn mozzarella salad, stone fruit bruschetta, Brussels sprouts and handmade pappardelle, sweet potatoes with feta dressing, and chocolate hazelnut cake cups. The overall consensus was that this gorgeously illustrated cookbook is full of simple dishes that give a lot of flavor and nutrition for minimal effort, and that we would all be incorporating recipes from the book into our repertoires.

The Cookbook Club's July cookbook is Patti Jinich's Treasures of the Mexican Table, and in August the club will be digging into seasonal pestos and desserts. In September the club will be reminded that store-bought is just fine with Ina Garten's Barefoot in Paris. 


