The meal began with delicious spice-glazed bar nuts, accompanied by Bourdain-favorite beverages, lime rickeys, caipirinhas and caipiroskas. From there, diners delighted in a Caesar Salad with a gorgeous homemade dressing, with their choice of Bourdain's croutons, or store-bought - the consensus was his recipe was off on those. The New Mexico beef chili was warm and comforting on a late winter evening, and went nicely with the spicy macaroni and cheese and the polenta crescents. The chicken pot pie was

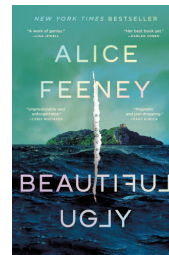
