Around the Library


Little known fact: the best place to purchase a new copy of the books that are copyrighted by Wiscasset Public Library is right inside the Library.


- Wiscasset in Pownalborough by Fannie Chase published 1967, \$65.00.




Join us for Summer Reading



Guests were greeted with a nibble board of delightful cheeses, crackers, balsamic onion jam, olives, pickles, grapes, sliced meats, and basil infused vodka lemonade. Fluffy ginger scones and salted honey butter were added to the board as diners chatted and enjoyed both the food and the art-filled home. Beautiful peach and bread salad and Mediterranean mess welcomed diners to

the table, and the seated portion of the meal began. The delicious salads were bright and fresh, and combined on plates to create a third, equally fabulous treat. Rich, flavorful asparagus and tarragon soup and flaky layered backyard biscuits with roasted rhubarb butter delighted diners. Luscious, creamy polenta and succulent pickle brined roast chicken with apples and pears asked diners to loosen their waistbands, and then came the desserts. Creamy, lush salted caramel custards with whipped cream was a taste treat, and Aunt Vinci's (delicious) oatmeal cake was moist and gorgeously spiced - another superlative meal in the books. In May the club will cook from Marcella Hazan's Essentials of Classic Italian Cooking, and June will be Cooking Light's Best Ofs. 
