All library employees will participate in an intensive three-day training course to learn the new Polaris circulation system. Library Museum Pass Program

As part of our mission to enrich the communities we serve, the Wiscasset Public Library's Museum Pass Program allows WPL patrons to visit several cultural and educational attractions in our area. This year, we have passes available for Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens, Farnsworth Art Museum, Portland Museum of Art and Historic New England.

How the Museum Pass Program Works (FAQs)

How do I reserve a museum pass?

Call WPL at 882-7161 to reserve your pass. Please note that we need 30 minutes to process your request. We cannot fill same-day requests after 4:30pm (weekdays) or 1:30pm (weekends).

How far in advance can I book a museum pass?

A museum pass may be booked 7 days in advance.

Is there a charge to borrow a pass?

No, museum passes are free to borrow with a Wiscasset Public Library Card in good standing.

How do I get the pass?

Pick up your pass at the WPL Circulation Desk. Please reserve your pass at least 30 minutes beforehand.

What is 'Day of Use'?

'Day of Use' is the day you plan on visiting the museum. You will need to indicate the Day of Use when reserving your pass.

Can I cancel my reservations?

No. We have no way to cancel the tickets once the pass has been processed.

How many people are admitted per pass to a museum?

It depends on the pass. Each museum has its own admission rules. Generally speaking, up to two adults will be admitted for free using a Library Pass. Check with the Library for more information.

Who can reserve a pass?

WPL patrons, 18 years and older, with an active library card in good standing may reserve a pass.

How many passes can I reserve a day?

You can reserve one (1) pass per day per library card.

How frequently can I reserve a pass?

You may reserve each pass an unlimited number of times. However, you can only reserve a pass for one museum at a time. Reserved, but unused, passes are considered "checked out and in use" until the Day of Use has passed.

What determines the admission rules and requirements?

Each museum has its own set of admission rules and requirements. The Library is required to follow those rules, or risk losing privileges with the museum. Check the museum website (see links above) for further information.


The Book Group will meet next on **Thursday**, **July 21 at 10:15** in the Fiction Room. Bring a favorite title to share.

New in Nonfiction: Go By Boat



Dr. Chuck Radis shares his experiences in *Go by Boat: Stories of a Maine Island Doctor.* Fresh out of training, he and his family moved to Peaks Island, Maine, to fulfill a Public Health scholarship obligation. New to island life and working without most traditional testing equipment, Dr. Radis is forced to use his physical examination skills and his limited supplies to manage his patients and their care. Traveling to the surrounding islands only adds to the difficulties of the practice. With these stories, hilarious

to heart breaking, Dr. Radis draws the reader into the distinct culture of Maine island communities. Come along for the ride as Dr. Radis learns the mores of island living and finds acceptance and friendship on the hardscrabble islands of Casco Bay.

New Fiction: The Dept of Rare Books & Special Collections

Eva Jurczyk's debut novel, *The Department of Rare Books and Special Collections*, introduces us to Liesl Weiss. Liesl finds herself running the rare books department when her supervisor has a stroke. This librarian's quiet life is turned upside down when she discovers a priceless manuscript is missing from the collection. She wants to call the police to investigate. She is repeatedly told to keep quiet and to just keep the library running as usual.



When a co-worker stops coming to work, Liesl is compelled to uncover the secrets of both disappearances. Someone in the department must be behind the theft and she is determined to find the answer.

New in Large Print: Paradise Falls


Paradise Falls: The True Story of an Environmental Catastrophe recounts the discovery and fight to clean up over twenty tons of toxic waste. In the spring of

Worried mothers soon identified the curious scent the smell of as sickly-sweet chemicals. Through their persistence, they discovered Hooker Chemical's deadly secret of Love Canal — and exposed one of America's most devastating toxic waste disasters. This extraordinary story highlights the efforts of these determined mothers who sparked the modern environmental movement.
